1	Compliance	<p>The Creekside GC president and committee are responsible for compliance with the VCGLR Liquor Licence and the requirements of Schedule 1 of <i>the Act 1998</i></p> <p>Note 1 >> Non-compliance with VCGLR requirements could result in loss of Licence and/or a Fine</p>												
2	Trading Hours	<p>The VCGLR Licence restricts the 'Pick & Pay' sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages to the following days and times:</p> <table border="0"> <tr> <td>> Sunday</td> <td>10:00am ~ 6:00pm</td> <td>[scheduled CGC Handicap Pennant Comp. <u>only</u>]</td> </tr> <tr> <td>> Wednesday</td> <td>5:00pm ~ 9:00pm</td> <td>[scheduled CGC Twilight Competition <u>only</u>]</td> </tr> <tr> <td>> Thursday</td> <td>12noon ~ 4:00pm</td> <td>[scheduled CGC Seniors Pennant Competition <u>only</u>]</td> </tr> <tr> <td>> Saturday</td> <td>9:30pm ~ 6:00pm</td> <td>> ANZAC Day 12noon ~ 6:00pm</td> </tr> </table> <p>On-Duty Person* must be in attendance for legal trading activity *Management Committee Member [refer Schedule 1 (e)]</p> <p>Note 2 >> 'Pick and Pay' describes that CGC does not utilize the face-to-face method of alcohol sales</p> <p>Note 3 >> Alcohol sales could be terminated at any time, at the discretion of the On-Duty Person</p>	> Sunday	10:00am ~ 6:00pm	[scheduled CGC Handicap Pennant Comp. <u>only</u>]	> Wednesday	5:00pm ~ 9:00pm	[scheduled CGC Twilight Competition <u>only</u>]	> Thursday	12noon ~ 4:00pm	[scheduled CGC Seniors Pennant Competition <u>only</u>]	> Saturday	9:30pm ~ 6:00pm	> ANZAC Day 12noon ~ 6:00pm

3	Red Line Plan	<p>The Red Line defines the area where alcohol can be consumed within the Clubroom and surrounds; drinking is <u>not permitted</u> outside of this area</p> <p>Note 4 >> Sealed drinks provided by CGC, including wine (raffle prize), must not be consumed in the Morack carpark</p> <p>All members should familiarize with the Red Line Plan which is displayed prominently in the Clubrooms, below the current Licence and the approved VCGLR posters</p> <p>Members and Guests are to comply with all of the requirements of this restricted area</p>												
4	Club Membership	An eligible Member is a person who has paid the current annual membership fee by the due date, as nominated by the Committee												
5	Guest of a Member	<p>The details of the guests of Members are to be entered in the Visitors Book</p> <p>Alcohol must not be supplied to a Guest of a Member unless they are with the Member</p> <p>A Member must ensure that their Guest complies with these Club Rules</p> <p>A person who is not a Member can not be admitted as an Honorary or Temporary Member</p>												
6	Minors (<18 years)	<p>An Underage Person (a Minor) is not permitted within the Red Line Plan unless they are in the company of a responsible adult (parent, grandparent, aunt, uncle or legal guardian)</p> <p>Any person, when requested by the president or a committee member, must provide Proof of Age as shown on an approved document (e.g. driver's Licence, passport, visa, etc.)</p> <p>A Minor can not serve, be served or consume alcoholic beverages on the Clubs' premises</p>												
7	Unacceptable Behaviour	<p>Members are required to respect the age, gender, disability, ethnicity, sexual orientation, religious background and education level of other Members and Guests</p> <p>Offensive language, discrimination, harassment and bullying, or aggressive physical acts are also examples of unacceptable behaviour</p> <p>An act or verbal comments, that threatens the valued inclusive culture within Creekside GC operations, should not be encouraged nor tolerated</p> <p>The operation of Creekside GC during the approved Trading Hours must be such as not to cause nuisance or offence to any of the neighboring residents</p> <p>A Member or Guest who is deemed 'affected' (intoxicated or disorderly) will not be served any more alcoholic beverages</p> <p>The president or committee member must exercise a reasonable duty of care to ensure that the 'affected' person has a means of safe transport to their home address</p>												
8	Incident Register	<p>The committee is to maintain an Incident Register to record the details of instances of unacceptable behaviour</p> <p>When necessary, the president may select an incident to be investigated by nominated committee member's. A report will be tabled at the next committee meeting</p>												
9	Raffles Management	<p>Reverse raffles are illegal in Victoria. The Gaming Regulation 83(1)(h) - 2015 states that: '<i>if there is more than one prize, the <u>first</u> raffle ticket drawn must win <u>first</u> prize</i>'</p> <p>Each major prize will be a voucher stating the value credited to the winner's GSM Morack account. Note: The voucher value is non-transferrable</p>												
10	Communication	These Club Rules will be prominently displayed in the Clubroom. They will be regularly reviewed and communicated to members, via the <i>Presidents Newsletter</i> (email)
